Stay safe, may Allah swt protect you all.

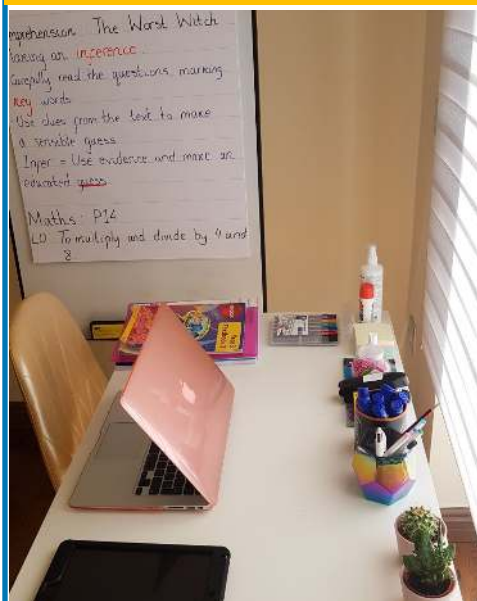
## HADITH OF THE WEEK

The Prophet ﷺ taught us a few simple words to say for Laylatul-Qadr. Aisha (ra) said: "O Messenger of Allah! What if I knew which night Laylatu-Qadr was, then what should I say in it?" He ﷺ said: "Say: "Allahumma innaka 'afuwun tuhibbul 'afwa fa'fu 'annee." which means: O Allah you are the one Who pardons greatly, and loves to pardon, so pardon me. Are there any signs to help us know that Laylatul-Qadr has taken place? The simple answer is: Yes. The Messenger of Allah ﷺ described the morning after Lailatul-Qadr, so that Muslims may know which day it is. He ﷺ said: "On the morning following Laylatul-Qadr, the sun rises not having any rays, as if it were a brass dish, until it rises up." [Muslim, Abu Dawood, Tirmidhi, ibn Majah]
