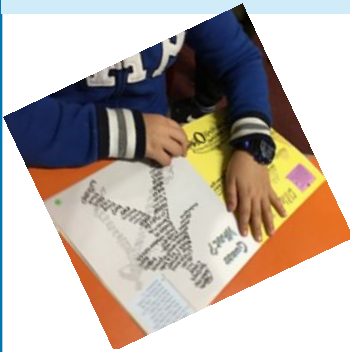
The Right of the Fortnight
