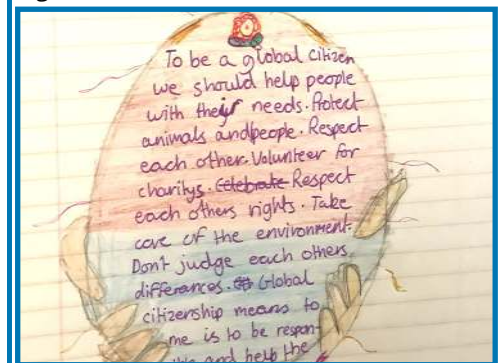
## Key Stage 2

"I play on my scooter and am practising how to catch. I play in the snow." Sara, Y3

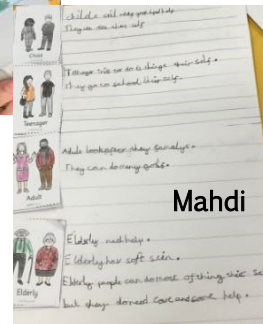


## Key Stage One
