Children's Mental Health Week was introduced. It takes place next week, with the theme 'Express Yourself', encouraging children to express how they feel, creatively.

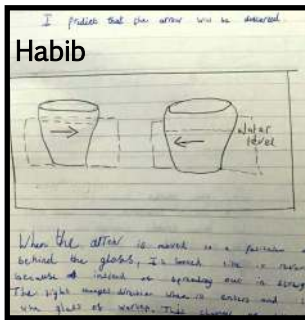

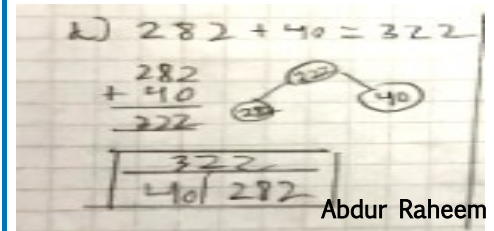
I can identify and compare soluble and insoluble materials.

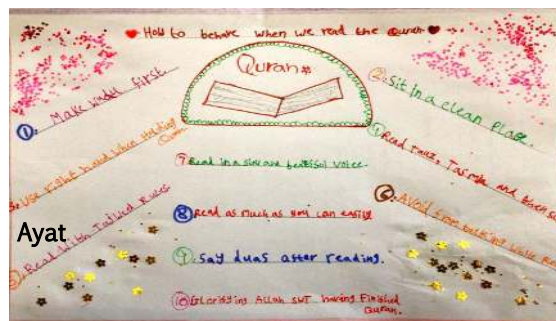
