MATHEMATICS

Numbers, addition and subtraction

Count in 2s to 20, 10s to 100 and count in 5s to 50. Count on in 10s from any number back to 100. Use language: equal to, more than, less/fewer than, most, least when comparing numbers. Recognise odd and even numbers; multiply by 2, 5, 10 by counting in groups/sets. Understand the link between multiplication and grouping and solve problems involving multiplication and division.

Time

Recognise and use language relating to date, including days, weeks, months and years. Tell the time to the nearest hour, half hour and quarter hour on analogue and digital clocks.

Units of Measurement

Compare and measure lengths or heights using non-standard uniform unit. Read, interpret and begin to create a simple pictograms/blocks graphs. Measure lengths using non-standard and uniform units.

Geometry

Recognise, name and describe different shapes. Use 2D and 3D shapes to create patterns.

ENGLISH

Live

We will continue exploring this unit where the children will read a traditional tale from India, *The Best of Friends*. Children will describe characters, identify good storytelling techniques, and explore strategies for remembering a sequence of events. They will later compose and rehearse their own retelling of the story and eventually perform them in small groups.

Non-fiction

In this unit, the children explore the Big Question: *What's the best job?* They will read interactive books, find information and use drama to explore different roles. They will create a fact file and learn how to write a job application, focusing on what they think they are good at. They will answer the Big Question, planning and writing their own instruction text based on a model.



SCIENCE

Everyday Materials

In this unit, the children will learn about everyday materials including wood, plastic, metal, water and rock. Children will learn to identify and name everyday materials and explore the properties of these materials. They will carry out a simple investigation to help them decide which material would be most suitable to use for an umbrella. At the end of the unit, children apply their knowledge of everyday materials to sort objects by their properties.

COMPUTING

Children will use their computer skills in a painting application. By the end of this unit, children will know how to navigate the application, paint with different colours and brushes, create shapes, fill areas, undo and redo and add text.



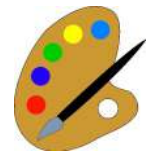
HUMANITIES



How did the first flight change the world?

In this unit, the children will learn the story behind the first aeroplane flight and explore the impact it had on the world. Children will develop curiosity to know more about the past and draw contrasts between their own lives and lives of people in the past.

ART



Fabricate

Children will weave paper and other materials to create placemats, inspired by textiles artist Gunta Stolz. Children will learn about the decorative art of Gustav Klimt before adding decoration to their placemats. They will then use their paper weaving skills to create gifts. Children will then learn about the use of traditional batik in Indonesia and around the world before designing and making their own batik coasters.

PSHE

Money Matters

This unit encourages children to think about where money comes from and how it can be used. Children will discuss the idea of spending and saving their money and begin to understand why it is important to keep belongings, including money safe. They will also learn about how we need to identify the difference between the things we want and the things we need.

PE

Attacking and defending

This unit will teach the children skills players need in different team games. They will learn about attacking skills, such as passing a ball to another player, and dodging defenders. They will develop their defending skills, looking at how to mark players and how to defend a space. Children will have the opportunity to play a range of mini team games to help them identify and improve their skills.
